

## **1. A SAFETY INFORMATION**


Before the installation and use of the appliance, carefully read the supplied instructions. The manufacturer is not responsible if an incorrect installation and use causes injuries and damages. Always keep the instructions with the appliance for future reference.





## **1.1** Children and vulnerable people safety

### WARNING!



- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- Do not let children play with the appliance.
- Children of less than 3 years should be kept away unless continuously supervised.
- Keep all packaging away from children and dispose of it appropriately.
- Keep detergents away from children.
- Keep children and pets away from the appliance when the door is open.
- If the appliance has a child safety device, this should be activated.
- Children shall not carry out cleaning and user maintenance of the appliance without supervision.

## **1.2** General Safety

- Do not change the specification of this appliance.
- If the tumble dryer is put on top of a washing machine, use the stacking kit. The stacking kit, available from your authorized vendor, can be used only with the appliance specified in the instructions, supplied with the accessory. Read it carefully before installation (Refer to the Installation leaflet).
- The appliance can be installed as freestanding or below the kitchen counter with correct space (Refer to the Installation leaflet).

- Do not install the appliance behind a lockable door, a sliding door or a door with a hinge on the opposite side, that would prevent the appliance door from being fully opened.
- The ventilation opening in the base must not be covered by a carpet, mat, or any floor covering.
- WARNING: The appliance must not be supplied through an external switching device, such as timer, or connected to a circuit that is regularly switched on and off by a utility.
- Connect the mains plug to the mains socket only at the end of the installation process. Make sure that the mains plug is accessible after installation.
- Ensure good air ventilation in the located room to avoid the backflow of unwanted gases into the room from appliances burning gas or other fuels, including open fires.
- If the mains power supply cable is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its Authorised Service Centre or similarly qualified persons to avoid an electrical hazard.
- Do not exceed the maximum load of 8 kg (refer to the "Programme chart" chapter).
- Do not use the appliance if items have been soiled with industrial chemicals.
- Wipe away lint or packaging debris that has accumulated around the appliance.
- Do not run the appliance without a filter. Clean the lint filter before or after each use.
- Do not dry unwashed items in the tumble dryer.
- Items that have been soiled with substances such as cooking oil, acetone, alcohol, petrol, kerosene, spot removers, turpentine, waxes and wax removers should be washed in hot water with an extra amount of detergent before being dried in the tumble dryer.
- Items such as foam rubber (latex foam), shower caps, waterproof textiles, rubber backed articles and clothes

or pillows fitted with foam rubber pads should not be dried in the tumble dryer.

- Fabric softeners, or similar products, should only be used as specified by the product manufacturer's instructions.
- Remove all objects from items that could be a source of fire ignition such as lighters or matches.
- WARNING: Never stop a tumble dryer before the end of the drying cycle unless all items are quickly removed and spread out so that the heat is dissipated.
- Before any maintenance operation, deactivate the appliance and disconnect the mains plug from the socket.

## 2. CONDITIONS OF USE

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:

 By clients in serviced apartments, holiday apartments and other residential type environments.

## **3.** SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

## 3.1 Installation

- Remove all the packaging.
- Do not install or use a damaged appliance.
- Follow the installation instruction supplied with the appliance.
- Always take care when moving the appliance as it is heavy. Always use safety gloves and enclosed footwear.
- Do not install or use the appliance where the temperature can be less than 5°C or higher than 35°C.
- The floor area where the appliance is to be installed must be flat, stable, heat resistant and clean.
- Make sure that there is air circulation between the appliance and the floor.
- Always keep the appliance vertical when being moved.
- The rear surface of the appliance must be put against the wall.
- When the appliance is in its permanent position, check that it is

fully level with the aid of a spirit level. If it is not, adjust the feet accordingly.

## 3.2 Electrical connection

#### WARNING!

Risk of fire and electrical shock.

- Connect the mains plug to the mains socket only at the end of the installation. Make sure that there is access to the mains plug after the installation.
- The appliance must be earthed.
- Make sure that the parameters on the rating plate are compatible with the electrical ratings of the mains power supply.
- Always use a correctly installed shockproof socket.
- Do not use multi-plug adapters and extension cables.

- Do not pull the mains cable to disconnect the appliance. Always pull the mains plug.
- Do not touch the mains cable or the mains plug with wet hands.
- This appliance complies with the E.E.C. Directives.

### 3.3 Use



#### WARNING!

Risk of injury, electrical shock, fire, burns or damage to the appliance.

- Do not dry the damaged items which contain padding or fillings.
- Only dry fabrics which are applicable to dry in the tumble dryer. Follow the instructions on the fabric label.
- If you have washed your laundry with a stain remover start an extra rinse cycle before you start the dryer.
- Do not drink or prepare food with the condensed water/distilled water. It can cause health problems to people and pets.
- Do not sit or stand on the open door.
- Do not dry dripping wet clothes in the tumble dryer.
- Oil-affected items can ignite spontaneously, especially when exposed to heat sources such as in a tumble dryer. The items become warm, causing an oxidation reaction in the oil. Oxidation creates heat. If the heat cannot escape, the items can become hot enough to catch fire. Piling, stacking or storing oil-affected items can prevent heat from escaping and create a fire hazard.
- If it is unavoidable that fabrics that contain vegetable or cooking oil or have been contaminated by hair care products be placed in a tumble dryer they should first be washed in hot water with extra detergent -this will reduce, but not eliminate, the hazard.

### 3.4 Internal light

WARNING! Risk of injury.

• Visible LED radiation, do not look directly into the beam.

- The LED lamp is dedicated to drum lighting. This lamp cannot be reused for other lighting purposes.
- To replace the internal light, contact the Authorised Service Centre.

### 3.5 Care and cleaning

#### WARNING!

Risk of injury or damage to the appliance.

- Do not use water spray and steam to clean the appliance.
- Clean the appliance with a moist soft cloth. Only use neutral detergents. Do not use any abrasive products, abrasive cleaning pads, solvents or metal objects.
- To prevent damage to the cooling system be careful when you clean the appliance.

### 3.6 Compressor

#### WARNING!



Risk of damage to the appliance.

• The compressor and its system in the tumble dryer is filled with the special agent which is free from fluoro-chloro-hydrocarbons. This system must stay tight. The damage of the system can cause a leakage.

### 3.7 Service

- To repair the appliance contact an Authorised Service Centre.
- Use original spare parts only.

### 3.8 Disposal





- Disconnect the appliance from the mains electrical and water supplies.
- Cut off the mains electrical cable close to the appliance and dispose of it.
- Remove the door catch to prevent children or pets from becoming trapped in the drum.
- Dispose of the appliance in accordance with local requirements

for the disposal of Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE).



## 6. FIRST TIME START-UP

When you turn on your dryer for the first time, the Start-up Screen (shows the AEG logo and the time ) appears on the touch screen and plays each time you turn on the dryer.

After the animation plays, you are guided through the initial setup procedure.





### 6.2 Time setup

1. Scroll the bar of hours and minutes to the right or left to set the current time.



2. To select the time tap on the clock bar.




**3.** To accept the time tap on **OK**, if you want to change it tap on**Change**.

change in to the summary screen. The dryer is ready to use.





### Water Hardness

- For optimal performance set the water hardness by pressing Change or press OK to leave the default Medium water hardness.




If you press **OK**, the warnings of full water tank is still enabled. The program list appears and in a few seconds it will change in to the summary screen.

## 7. USING THE TOUCH SCREEN

Every time you turn on your dryer, the Start-up Screen (shows the logo and the time ) appears on the touch screen.



After the Start-up animation plays, the program summary screen appears on the touch screen.

# **8.1** Installing and configuring AEG Life

When connecting the tumble dryer to the application, stand near it with Your smart device.

Make sure that your smart device is connected to the wireless network.

- 1. Go to the App Store on your smart device.
- 2. Download and install App AEG Life .
- **3.** Make sure you started a Wi-fi connection in the dryer. If not go to the section below.
- **4.** Start the application. Select the country and language and login with Your email and password. If you do not have an account, create a new one following the instructions in AEG Life.
- **5.** Follow the instructions on the App for the appliance registration and configuration.

A message appears on the appliance display to confirm that the configuration was successful.


# **8.2** Configuring the dryer wireless connection

Have AEG Life downloaded and installed on your smart device.


1. Tap on the **Wi-Fi** bar to switch the connection on .

A pop-up message will appear, the icon

starts flashing and wireless module begins starting up. It may take about 2 minute before it is ready.



When the wireless module is ready, popup message will appear to inform you, that the access point will be open for about 3 minute.



4. Tap on **OK** to get back to the machine settings list.

## 8.3 🗟 Remote Start Mode


You can start and stop a drying programme remotely.

When the App is installed and the wireless connection is complete, the **Remote Start Mode** option will appear among the available options.

To activate the remote start:

- 1. In the programme summery screen, tap ☑ More to enter the option list.
- 2. Tap on Remote Start Mode bar (ON status).

The following message pops up:



3. Press the Start/Pause button to activate the Remote Start Mode.

The indicator **b** appears on the programme summary screen.



If the door is open, the **Remote Start Mode** is deactivated.

### 8.4 Over-the-air update

The App may propose an update for downloading new features.

## 9. BEFORE FIRST USE

Rear drum locks are removed automatically when dryer is activated for the first time. Possible to hear some noise.

#### To unlock the rear drum locks:

- 1. Switch on the appliance.
- 2. Set any programme.

**3.** Press the Start/Pause button. Drum starts to rotate. Rear drum locks are deactivated.

## **10. PROGRAMMES**

The update is accepted via App only.

If a programme is running, the App notifies that the update will start at the end of the programme.

During the update, the appliance shows a message telling that update is running.

The appliance will usable again at the end of the update, without any notification about successful update.

If an error occurs, the appliance warns that update has failed: just press any buttons or turn the knob to return to normal use.

- Clean the tumble dryer drum with a moist cloth.
- Start a 1 hour programme with moist laundry.
  - At the beginning of the drying cycle (first 3-5 min) there could be a slightly higher sound level. This is due to the compressor starting up. This is normal for compressor powered appliances such as refrigerators and freezers.

## 11. OPTIONS

## 11.1 <sup>dB</sup> Extra Silent

The appliance operates with low noise without effect on the drying quality. The appliance operates slowly with longer cycle time.

## 11.2 🛇 Eco

This option is on by default with all programs.

The power consumption is at the minimum level.

## 11.3 <sup>()</sup> Dryness Level

This function helps to get the laundry more dried. There are 4 possible selections:

- Extra Dry
- Cupboard Dry+ (for Cotton only)
- Cupboard Dry
- Iron Dry

## 

For cottons, synthetics and mixed. Lets the user to set drying time from minimum 10 min to maximum of 2 hours (in 10 min steps). When this option is maximum, load indicator disappears.



The cycle lasts as long as set time regardless the drying result.

## 11.5 ⑰ Anti-crease

Extends up to 120 minutes the anticrease phase (30 minutes) at the end of the

drying cycle. After drying phase drum rotates time to time what prevents the clothes from creases. Laundry can be removed during the anti-crease phase.

## 11.6 <sup>년까</sup> Load

This option is applicable only to the Wool programme to get laundry more dried. There are 3 possible selections:

- Heavy
- Normal
- Light

## 11.7 <sup>(1)</sup> Delay Start

- Lets to delay the start of a drying program from minimum of 10 minutes to maximum of 24 hours.
- 1. Set the drying program and options.
- 2. In the option menu tap on the **Delay Start** bar to enter the submenu.
- **3.** Scroll left or right the hour and minute bars to set the desired delay start.
- 4. To activate **Delay Start** option, touch the **Start/Pause** button.

After touching the Start/Pause button, the appliance begins the countdown.



Any time you can stop the countdown of the delay time by pressing the **Reset** button.

## 11.8 ☆ Memory

Lets you memorise up to 2 of your favorite configurations of programmes and options in the appliance memory. After memorising configurations you are able to choose them from the program list. Your favorite configurations are marked in the program list as **M1** and **M2**.

## 12. DAILY USE

### 12.1 Preparing the laundry

- Close the zips.
- Close the fasteners of duvet covers.
- Do not dry ties or ribbons loose (e.g. apron ribbons). Tie them before you start a programme.
- Remove all items from pockets.
- Turn items with internal layer made of cotton inside out. Cotton layer must be faced outward.
- Always set the programme suitable for the type of laundry.
- Do not put light and dark colours together.

- Use suitable programme for cottons, jersey and knitwear to reduce shrinkage.
- Do not exceed the maximum load stated in programmes chapter or shown on the display.
- Dry only the laundry that is suitable for tumble drying. Refer to the fabric label on the items.
- Do not dry large and small items together. Small items can be trapped inside the large items and remain wet.

### 12.2 Loading the laundry




#### CAUTION!

Ensure the laundry is not trapped between the appliance door and rubber seal.

- 1. Pull open the appliance door.
- 2. Load the laundry one item at a time.
- **3.** Close the appliance door.

## 12.3 Turning on the appliance



To turn on the appliance:

Push the On/Off button.

If the appliance is on the display lights up.

## 12.4 Auto Off function

To decrease the energy consumption, the Auto Off function turns off the appliance automatically:


- if no selection was done in the last 5 minutes.

### 12.7 Starting a program




To start the program, Touch the **Start/ Pause** button.

The appliance starts and the LED above the button stops flashing and stays on.

On the screen you can find:

- the name of the program.
- the remaining drying time.
- the progress bar.
- the phase of a cycle (drying, anticrease, cooling).
- the possible end time of the program.



### Child lock option activation:

At any time during the drying you can activate the child lock option.

- 1. Tap on the option ist. It icon to get to the option list.
- 2. Tap on the child lock option.

The option icon will change into the child lock  $\boxdot$  icon.



### 12.8 Program change

To change a program:

If the drying cycle is finished, the symbol

o appears on the display. If the ⊄ Cycle End Buzzer option is activated, the acoustic signal sounds intermittently for 1 minute.

**i** If you do not turn off the appliance, the anti-crease phase starts (not active with all programs). Laundry can be removed during this phase.

At the end of the anti-crease phase the display tells that the anti-crease phase is finished and shows **0h00min** 

To remove the laundry:

- Push the On/Off button for 2 seconds to turn the appliance off.
- 2. Open the appliance door.
- 3. Remove the laundry.
- 4. Close the appliance door.




The sound is heard at the:

• cycle end

• start and end of crease guard phase You can use this option to deactivate the buzzer or control the duration of the buzzer . There are 3 levels of sound duration (Short, Mid and Long).

To deactivate the buzzer or set the new duration of the sound:

- 1. Tap on Cycle End Buzzer bar.
- **2.** Scroll the bar to the right or left to set the desired value.



3. Tap on Cycle End Buzzer bar to get back to the machine settings list or tap on <**Programmes** bar to get to the summary screen.

## 13.5 🖽 Water Hardness

Water hardness can be different for different locations. Water hardness has an effect on the water conductivity and the operation of the conductivity sensor in the appliance. If you know the value of the water conductivity you can adjust the sensor to dry with the better results (recommended to set the "soft water hardness" to get the laundry more dried).

The appliance allows you to chose between 3 levels (Hard, Medium, Soft) corresponding to different ranges of water hardness.



To deactivate or activate the indicator tap on the **Water Tank Warning** bar.

One of 2 configurations is possible:

- The indicator is activated (status is ON)
- The indicator is deactivated (status is **OFF**)



## 14. HINTS AND TIPS

### 14.1 Ecological hints

- Spin the laundry well before drying.
- Do not exceed the load sizes which are specified in the programs chapter.
- Clean the filter after each drying cycle.
- Do not use fabric softener to wash and then dry. In the tumble dryer laundry becomes soft automatically.

## **15.** CARE AND CLEANING


### 15.1 Cleaning the filter

At the end of each cycle the message **Clean the lint filter** comes on the display and you must clean the filter.



The filter collects the fluff during the drying cycle.


1. Open the door. Pull the filter up.




2. Push the hook to open the filter.

 To confirm the factory reset tap on OK or Cancel to leave the current settings.


- Use distilled water like that used for steam ironing. If it is necessary, clean the distilled water before (e.g. with a coffee filter) to remove any particles.
- Always keep the airflow slots at the bottom of the appliance clear.
- Make sure there is good airflow where the appliance is to be installed.



**3.** Use a moist hand to clean both parts of the filter.



- **4.** If necessary, clean the filter with a vacuum cleaner. Close the filter.
- If necessary, remove fluff from the filter socket and gasket. You can use a vacuum cleaner. Place the filter back inside the filter socket.



# **15.2** Emptying the water container

Empty the condensed water container after each drying cycle.


If the condensed water container is full, the programme stops automatically. The message **Water Tank Warning** comes on the display and you must empty the water container.

To empty the water container:

1. Pull the water container out keeping it in a horizontal position.



**2.** Pull the plastic connection out and drain the water into a basin or equivalent receptacle.



- **3.** Push the plastic connection back in and place the water container back into position.
- **4.** To continue the programme press the Start/Pause button.

### 15.3 Cleaning the condenser

#### If the message **Clean the heat**


**exchanger area** comes on the display, inspect the condenser and its compartment. If it is dirty, clean it. Do the check not less than once a 6 months.





2. Open the condenser cover.



**3.** Turn the lever to unlock the condenser lid.



4. Lower the condenser lid.



5. If necessary, remove the fluff from the condenser and its compartment. You can use a wet cloth and/or a vacuum cleaner with a brush attachment.



- **6.** Close the condenser lid.
- **7.** Turn the lever until it clicks into position.
- 8. Put the filter back.

### 15.4 Cleaning the drum

WARNING!

Disconnect the appliance before you clean it.

Use a standard neutral soap detergent to clean the inner surface of the drum and drum lifters. Dry the cleaned surfaces with a soft cloth.



#### CAUTION!

Do not use abrasive materials or steel wool to clean the drum.

# **15.5** Cleaning the control panel and housing

Use a standard neutral soap detergent to clean the control panel and housing.

Use a moist cloth to clean. Dry the cleaned surfaces with a soft cloth.

Do not use furniture cleaning agents or cleaning agents which can cause corrosion.

Use a vacuum cleaner to remove fluff from the airflow slots.







Read carefully the instructions supplied with the accessory.

Appliances purchased in New Zealand;

- e) 'Warranty Period' means the period specified in clause 3 of this warranty;
